Twenty four pairs from 11 counties entered this event and Herts were represented by 4 pairs: **Lizzie Airey/Lexy Richards, Alex English/Georgia Pittson, Rachel Hibberd/Kirsty Southey and Amy George/Isabel Hatt**. Each pair played 5 matches in their group with the top two pairs in each group going through to the quarter finals.

Rachel/Kirsty won their match against Warwickshire, but were narrowly defeated in their other games. Amy/Isabel won 2 of their games but had stiff competition from Nottinghamshire, Avon and Gloucestershire. In group 4, Alex and Georgia did well to win 3 matches, losing only to Gloucestershire and Lancashire. Liz/Lex won all their matches, came top of their group and went on to play Nottinghamshire in the quarter final. After losing the first game 16-18, Herts were trailing in the second when one of the Notts pair was injured. Herts seized the advantage and managed to win 2-1. Aware of their good fortune, confidence was high as they approached the semi-final against Gloucestershire. The Herts pair displayed good communication skills and some wickedly disguised cross-court shots. Gloucestershire were despatched 15-10, 15-13. The final against Helen Briggs/Sarita Patel of hosts Leicestershire was a short-lived affair. Leicestershire dominated and won 15-8, 15-5 to collect the trophy. The girls were tired after their efforts but greatly enjoyed the day's play.

Herts Pumping as Hodgkinson and Sadler Bring Home Gold

Herts entered three very strong pairs to the Leicestershire Invitation Under 12s Boys Doubles on Sunday, October 15th 2006. The event was organised into four boxes of 7 or 8 county pairs with the top two progressing to the quarter finals. Box games were singles matches to 21 with no setting. Fourteen counties were represented with 29 pairs entered.

David Maughan/Matthew Widdicombe, whilst still under 11, continued their excellent track record against senior opposition with 3 wins. Although they were also defeated in 3 matches, these were all closely contested and they pushed the Essex pair all the way losing narrowly 19-21. They finished 4th of 7 in their box, a tremendous achievement given their age and they will be encouraged that they can mount a serious challenge for the silverware in this competition next year.

Edward Byrne/Gareth Lumb found themselves in perhaps the toughest box with stern competition from Buckinghamshire, Leicestershire and Staffordshire pairs. Despite this they rose to the challenge and defeated these teams to 17. 20 and 17 points, winning all their games in the box to finish on top with the Bucks pair qualifying in second place.

Max Hodgkinson/Mark Sadler faced 7 opponents in the biggest box. The Herts pair beat the strong Avon boys to 14 and played consistently well in their other matches. With 7 wins, Max/Mark finished the group in 1st place with Avon taking second.

Knock-out stages of the competition were decided in the best of 3 matches to 15 with setting. In the quarter finals Edward/Gareth met the Essex pair of T Phillips/L Sabatini. They made a great start taking the first game, but were pegged back to 1-1 in the second. In the deciding game they worked hard but were unfortunate to be narrowly defeated in a close match that could have gone either way.

Max/Mark comfortably won their quarter final against Lancashire in 2 games. In the semi-final they had a re-match against the Avon pair who had raised their game considerably to beat M Roe/P Mairs from Cheshire. Although they were given a much tougher match than the box game, Max/Mark triumphed again winning 15-10, 15-10. In the other semi-final the Bucks pair S Vandy/H Simcock, a surprise package given that they are still under 11, beat Essex 2 games to 1 in a closely contested match.

In the final Vandy/Simcock came out firing to take the first game 15-12. Max/Mark responded tremendously to level the match at 1-1 with a 15-7 win. In the final game points went evenly to both teams with a mixture of excellent shots and unforced errors as a result of fatigue and pressure. The Herts boys eventually worked up a small advantage and just as the Bucks pair seemed ready to accept defeat on championship point, they re-grouped taking several points off our boys to get to 14-12. Max/Mark made one last effort and pushed their opponents deep into their backhand court so that they were unable to make the return. So amongst much emotion and high-fives, Max Hodgkinson/Mark Sadler were crowned Leicestershire Invitation Under 12s Boys Doubles Champions for 2006. This was a good day for Herts boys who were the only county to get 2 pairs into the knockout stages and both as box winners.
