An all Hertfordshire final, Dominic/Jonathan against Matthew/Kamran saw a repeat performance of the Hertfordshire U13 Doubles played three weeks earlier in which Dominic/Jonathan were victorious. However, today the tables were turned and Matthew/Kamran came back from 2-11 down to win 15-13.

In the semi-finals of the Girls Alternate Doubles, Kate Lester/Rachel Warnes lost to the eventual winners

The Premier Girls singles was also predictable with all the seeds winning their boxes.
