Trials for 2013/14 County age group squads will be held at Hertfordshire Sports Village on Sunday 30 June at the following times:

13.00-15.00 hours Under 11 (Players born in 2003 or later)

15.00-18.00 hours Under 13 (Players born in 2001 or 2002)

15.00-18.00 hours Under 15 (Players born in 1999 or 2000)

11.00-13.00 hours Under 17 (Players born in 1997 or 1998)

Every player seeking a squad place must attend a trial for their own age group.

Players attending will complete a registration process on arrival at their trial, and this process can be speeded up by filling in a Player Information form beforehand and bringing it to the trial. This form can be obtained from the downloads page of the HSBA web-site at:

Herts teams in finals of Center Parcs National Schools Championships

Congratulations to the boys' Under 14 team from Monk's Walk School in Welwyn Garden City and the girls' Under 14 team from St Clement Danes School in Chorleywood, who took both the U14 top spots at the Eastern Region Finals held recently in Cambridge and will represent the Region at the Grand Final being hosted by Center Parcs on 20 April.

Monk's Walk secured a place in the final with a 5-0 win against Thomas Deacon Academy from Cambridgeshire and a 4-1 win against Suffolk's Thurston College at the group stage. Competing for the top spot in the final against Monk's Walk was Bedford. In the first match Chris Adey faced the number one boy from Bedford, whom he had beaten, but only narrowly, on the one previous occasion that they had met in an inter-county match. Chris knew that for Monk's Walk to have a fighting chance he had to win this match. The boys looked evenly matched at the outset, trading points. However, after a few gruelling rallies, the Bedford boy started to tire and Chris won the match 21-10. Matthew Harden and Calum Wilson fought hard in the second match but lost their doubles 21-16. The pressure was then on Jack Kimber to win his singles match against another county player from Bedford. He kept his nerve well to win 21-14, giving Monk's Walk a 2-1 lead going into the fourth match. Although the opposition stormed into a 7-1 lead, Chris Adey and Matthew Harden fought back to level the score and then took control, securing overall victory with a 21-15 win. The final match score was 3-2 to Monk's Walk.

St Clement Danes won their initial box comfortably, the score being 4-1 against both Bedford and Norwich High School. The other group was dominated by a strong-looking Chelmsford County High School representing Essex who didn't drop a game in either of their matches against schools from Suffolk and Cambridgeshire. Two of their players were recognised as being Essex U15 county players. The play-off against them didn't get off to a great start: Clement Danes were 2-0 down with only 3 games left so had to win all the remaining games, eek! First up April Miller had to play a girl with a higher BE ranking. After a tight start and lots of long rallies April's consistency and attacking play prevailed, and she won 21-15. Next up Ellen Jennings and Ashley Eales who were neck and neck for most of their doubles game against the Chelmsford pair, but Ashley served extremely well and Ellen managed to find gaps and dominate the play for a 21-17 win. 2 games all! Lastly April and Clement Danes' secret weapon Olive Coles went on for the last doubles to decide the match. They trailed for first half of the game, and it seemed Chelmsford just had too much strength in depth. But Olive just never gave up, and like Ellen in the previous game, April did a great job of taking charge whenever she got the chance. Then, at 13-15, April and Olive suddenly went up a gear and the Chelmsford pair seemed to crumble. Clement Danes won 21-16 and had got themselves a place in the National finals!

Unfortunately the opposition proved too tough for the Herts teams competing at U16 level. Verulam Boys' School were unlucky to lose all their matches 3-2. Presdales Girls' School came second in their group and finished on a high with a convincing 5-0 win against a Cambridgeshire School in the play-off for third place. Two U16 teams from Essex will join the two U14 teams from Herts at the Grand Final.

Double doubles success at Nationals!

17 March was a red-letter day for two squad players at the English National Championships Series, bringing victory in girls' and boys' doubles events. In Nottingham, Keya Patani, partnering Molly Chapman, triumphed in the Under 13 age group, winning their final over Helen and Sian Kelly by 21-10, 21-17. At the same time in Redbridge, Matthew Widdicombe and his long-time training partner Angus Pedersen were sweeping all before them to take the Under 17 title, with a finals victory by 21-16, 25-23 over Craig and Marcus Smith.

Notable results were achieved by several squad players across the age groups of the English National Championships Series, and full details are reported in our results round-up service on pages 11 and 12. This season it was Herts's turn to host this long-running event, and with the Under 13 and Under 15 squads both having good strength in depth in the age group, we were able to put out two teams to face opponents from Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire, Essex, Norfolk and Suffolk (or rather, there should have been a team from Norfolk, but for reasons still unexplained it did not materialise on the day!).

The needle match between Herts 1 and Herts 2 took place first, and while the 6-1 result in favour of Herts 1 may sound emphatic, in reality every game was hotly contested. The first team went on to win all its matches, most by some margin though with a wobble against Suffolk which resulted in a close 4-3 victory. The second team could not get the better of a strong Bedfordshire team, but won all its other games, including making a more convincing job of defeating Suffolk than the first team had! Games were closely fought throughout, with Herts 2's 6-1 victory over Cambridgeshire including two 21-20 scorelines, and it was an excellent achievement when Herts 1 emerged as winners and Herts 2 as the third-placed team behind Bedfordshire.

Monday 18 February, Under 13 Boys

In the Singles 11 of the 30 players who had entered were from Hertfordshire. There were many close fought contests but no Hertfordshire players managed to get out of their box. The players just missing out were: Rhys Clarke (who had the eventual winner, Levi Hoang from Suffolk, in his box) Ashay Dhingra, Daniel Lewis and myself. In the final Alex and myself, spurred on by the partisan crowd, got revenge for Rhys and soundly beat Evan Blake and Harry Hodges 21-7. Sadly there was no third place play-off.

Keya beat Roxy Ciocan (Bucks) in the quarter-final to join three Surrey girls in the semis. One of the semis, Charlotte Clark v Grace Li was very close with Charlotte squeaking through 22-20. Keya had a more comfortable win over Pascale Pumphrey 21-10. The final however was a comfortable win for Charlotte beating Keya 21-7 with an impressive show of strength and speed.

Two boxes made up the girls doubles. Charlotte Clark went through to the final again with partner Olivia Trevor where they met Kirsty Binstead and Emily Parmenter the winners of the other box. It was Charlotte's day as she and Olivia won 21-16.

Wednesday 20 February, Under 17 Boys

46 boys from 13 counties arrived at the recently refurbished Birchwood badminton hall in anticipation of this tournament. The hall was in great shape, although initially rather Siberian-like, and the day flowed smoothly, being expertly organised by the Widdicombe family.

There was an impressive number of Hertfordshire players, 13 in total (Wesley Chan, Sam Newlove, Daniel Fox, Jack Goode, Chris Adey, William Hickey, Edgar Titterton, , Harry Knill-Jones, Duncan Williams, Brett Maisey, Aaron Miller, Sajan Rajani and me), representing County squads from the U13s to U17s

The singles competition comprised 11 boxes. On the whole it was a positive day for Hertfordshire, with the majority of us winning at least one game. However, a special mention to Chris Adey, who as an U13 performed admirably, nearly qualifying from his box. Duncan was unlucky in his first knockout game in that he was one of the few who won his box not to get a bye into the quarter-finals. However, this didn't faze Duncan, who beat Christopher Wood from Essex in a close game 21-19. He then beat William Manners from Surrey 21-14 in the quarter-final. These two tough games may have taken their toll on Duncan as sadly he then lost to the eventual winner Henry Skinner from Kent 21-14 in the semi-final. This was a great effort from Duncan who led by example for the Herts players. In the other Semi-Final, Ethan James Sinclair from Bedfordshire beat Thomas Boardman from Norfolk 21-17, before losing 21-17 to Henry Skinner in a tense and exciting final.

In the doubles competition, there were 14 pairs across three boxes, with four Herts pairs: Hickey/Miller, who unfortunately lost all of their games and Adey/Newlove who, although they played well together with great spirit and fight, also lost all of their games. HSBA Age-group tournaments, Spring term 2012/13

Under 10 Singles, Under 13 singles, Under 13 doubles, 27 January

There were eighteen entrants in the Under 10 boys' singles, giving four boxes. In the main event the matches went very much according to seeding leading to a tense, hushed final where Harry Goode stole the show in a 21-15 showdown against Toby Goddard (Alex Smith and Thomas Reynolds were semi-finalists). In the Plate event Southill's Thomas Sweetenham beat Swifts club member Arin Hatrell 21-18; the semi-finalists being Joshua Lim and Harry Searle.

Unfortunately the girls' Under 10 event only had three entrants, and one didn't turn up so Elizabeth Bratton from Harpenden JBC was the winner after beating Rebecca Tweena from Norton St Nicholas 21-14. The Under 13 singles saw some fantastic play amongst the youngsters, real nail-biting stuff, especially in the group stages. Again the boys' event went very much according to seedings, with Christopher Adey eventually crowned champion after a victory over James Penver. In the Plate event Jacob Harper came out tops ahead of Chancellor's Sonny Ward 21-14. In the girls' competition, with two groups of three and one of four, Laura Anderson of Parmiters beat county team mate Monique Maisey from Monks Walk in the final, with Beth Adams and Eleanor McArdle as semi-finalists.

The boys' doubles was a fairly easy ride for Christopher Adey and James Penver all the way to the final where they beat Jamie Gall and Benjamin Plunkett. The Under 15 boys' doubles, with 17 pairs, was won in some style by Karlii Leung/Sam Newlove, in a thrilling final against Rees Clarke and Zach Daniels, with the plate event, again another close final, won by Romin Varia and Freddie Clarke over Shaun McKnight and Max Titterton.

The handicapped mixed doubles event, a first for HSBA, was a great success which I hope will be built upon in seasons to come. Each player was given a handicap according to their year of birth; the older the combination the higher the handicap. I would like to thank Liz Bateman at this juncture who very ably sorted out the handicap points and got all the pairs on court very successfully as if she had been doing it all her life – she certainly seemed to be more on the ball than I actually was.
