We had to compete against five other Counties - Bedfordshire, Northants, Norfolk, Essex and Suffolk. The format that we had to play was three mixed pairs in ranking order, one of each boy and girl singles and one pair level doubles for boys and girls, seven games in total as a team. The start time was 10.00 am and, as a team manager, I should have been there early but I just managed to get there in time for start of the matches. Luckily the first county that we had to play, Bedfordshire, did not turn up and we were awarded seven games without playing. #### <u>Under 13 Team Challenge, Regional Round</u> Duncan Conway (U13 Squad Manager)

Once again we were on the road to Mildenhall in Suffolk for the qualifying round of the oldest team competition for Under 13s. Indeed it is, I think, the second oldest junior team competition in England. So it is always important to do well in this event. If we finish first or second, we go through to the National Finals in March. Originally only one county went through to the finals, and it was a usually between ourselves and Essex. But since two have been going through, we have always gone to the finals, except for last year! So I hoped we could restore our competitive status.

Our regional competition was due to feature six counties. But when we got to Mildenhall we were told that Bedfordshire had withdrawn. We would therefore be playing Norfolk, Northamptonshire, Suffolk and Essex.

Our opening match was against Suffolk (who had pipped us to the second place in the finals last year). But this year was different. We won 4-2 on rubbers. Our boys played very well turning in excellent results except for one rubber going to three games. Our girls fought hard and kept their scores down to a good level.

The next match was against Northamptonshire. We won this 5-1. Northants had moved their best girl to the Doubles, but that was all they won. Our team took the rest decisively. And so on to the match against Norfolk. This we won 4-2. Again our winning matches were decisive, and even the two we lost were taken to three games by our players even if they couldn't quite get to a win.

We now had a break and a chance to evaluate where we were. So far we and Essex were unbeaten with that match all that remained for both of us. So both teams had booked a place in the finals – but was it to be as winner or runner-up? Essex had won all their matches by 6-0 and people were telling me that they had a very strong team especially their girls. But our boys were very strong also. So it would depend on how the strong parts of the team would play. And that is how it turned out. The match score was 3-3; the rubber score was 7-7, so we were down to counting points. Unfortunately they had more than us, so we came through as runners-up. But the finals are calling.
